Program Highlights

- Extended birth certificate services to both homeless and near homeless guests and expanded the reasons for which we would provide documentation to include housing, employment, benefits applications, and school.
- Began tracking the primary reasons guests stated they needed a
 birth certificate and/or state ID and followed up with guests to
 see if the documentation enabled them to achieve these goals.
- Established written policies to add a housing component to the Main Frame Job Readiness Program and signed a Memorandum of Understanding with CaringWorks, Inc. to partner on this endeavor.
- Established an Advocacy Task Force to work with our Advocate,
 Elizabeth Appley, on setting our annual legislative agenda.
- Held our first Advocacy Training and Day at the Capitol events to mobilize others in advocating for policy changes that either directly or indirectly affect our guests.









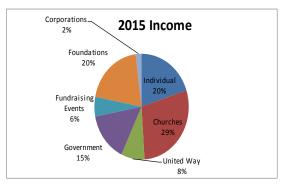

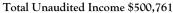

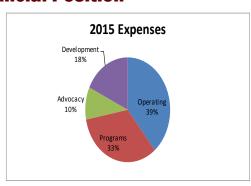

Total Unaudited Expenses \$400,001

Through partnerships, attention to our spending, and the continued faithful support of our donors, we maintained a positive cash flow throughout 2015 and ended the year in a positive net income position. We begin 2016 with enough in reserve to begin our planned giving program, increase services to our guests, and maintain a liquid cash reserve of three months' expenses.
